Archer Mayor, of Newfane, VT.

Archer Mayor is a novelist, author of over 20 mysteries, and winner of the 2004 New England Book Award for Fiction. In addition to writing, Mayor works as a “death investigator” for the Vermont State Medical Examiner’s Office and as a deputy for the Windham County Sheriff’s Department. He also volunteers for his local fire department and EMT squad. Mayor has taught at the Bread Loaf Writer’s Conference in Middlebury, and he has given seminars on forensic sciences at Colby College in Maine.

Elizabeth Metcalf, of Burlington, VT.

Born in Toronto, Canada, and a graduate of the University of Toronto and the Royal Conservatory of Music, Elizabeth Metcalf moved to Vermont in 1963. She is professor emeritus in the University of Vermont Music Department, having served as a faculty member from 1966 to 1999. Metcalf has performed throughout Vermont and the U.S. as both piano and harpsichord soloist and chamber musician, including many soloist (concerto) appearances with the Vermont Symphony Orchestra, the Vermont Baroque Ensemble, and the Burlington Chamber Orchestra. She has been a member of New York Chamber Soloists for over 20 years, and has performed with them throughout the U.S. and on tours of France, Spain and South America. She performs with the Soloists every summer in the Vermont Mozart Festival. A founding member of the Vermont Contemporary Music Ensemble, with whom she played until 1999, Metcalf continues to perform contemporary chamber music on both piano and harpsichord. In addition to performing, she maintains an active private teaching studio in Burlington.

Tom Slayton, of Montpelier, VT.

Editor-in-chief of *Vermont Life Magazine* from 1986 -2007, Tom Slayton left it a transformed and matured magazine when he retired in 2007. He is a native Vermonter and graduate of the University of Vermont. After serving a tour in the army, Slayton began a career as a newspaper reporter at the *Rutland Herald*. He served as chief of the Vermont Press Bureau and editorial page editor for the *Barre-Montpelier Times-Argus*. He has published ten books on various subjects related to travel, art, and literature, but mostly Vermont as a place. He has been a commentator for many years on Vermont Public Radio and he has produced a number of films on Vermont history. Slayton was granted an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree from UVM in 2006, and he also received an honorary doctorate from Southern Vermont College and the Franklin Fairbanks Award for outstanding service to Vermont and its people.

George C. Tooker, of Hartland, VT.

A visual artist elected to the National Academy of Design and the American Academy of Arts & Letters, George Tooker has also received the National Medal of the Arts. He is one of “Magic Realism’s” most prominent visual artists, and his work is displayed at the Whitney and the New York Metropolitan Museum of Art, as well as other prominent museums.

Dr. Judith Van Houten, of Richmond, VT.

The George H. Perkins Distinguished Professor of biology at the University of Vermont, Judith van Houten was elected as a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science in 2010. She was chair of her department for ten years, and is currently the Vermont State Director of the EPSCoR Program (Experimental Program to Stimulate Competitive Research). She is also Director of the HELiX Program (Hughes Endeavor for Life Science Excellence) which supports and encourages undergraduates in the sciences to stay in Science, and the Director of the Vermont Genetics Network. Van Houten has received numerous awards, including the Jackie M. Gribbons Leadership Award from Women in Higher Education, 2006.
